Woodcroft College is an independent coeducational Anglican school located in Morphett Vale. Established in 1989, Woodcroft welcomes students from ELC to Year 12 into a progressive, engaged and energetic learning community.

The College offers a broad curriculum complemented by an extra-curricular program designed to encourage students at all year levels to explore and understand their potential. Our commitment is to help every student *Find Their Remarkable*.

Woodcroft is known for its strong sense of community, a positive values-based culture and a learning and teaching environment driven by Guiding Principles.

The school enjoys an enviable reputation and attracts families from across the southern region of Adelaide. Enrolments have grown to 1,430 students from ELC to Year 12 and the College employs 284 staff.

As part of the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data for Students with Disabilities, 104 students across the College received adjustments to ensure that they had equal access to the schools' educational program.

Varied levels of adjustments (i.e. Quality Differentiated Teaching Practices QDTP, Supplementary, Substantial or Extensive) were provided to 50 primary students and 54 secondary students with disabilities identified in the areas of physical, cognitive, social and sensory disability.

34 students across the College were receiving QDTP at this time; 60 students received a supplementary level of adjustments; 10 received a substantial level of adjustments; and no student received an extensive level of adjustment to support learning.

59 students were supported with individual learning plans or personalised plans for learning in the Junior, Middle and Senior Schools.

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Teacher Qualifications

The College has highly trained and qualified staff, with all teaching staff meeting the requirements of the Teachers Registration Board. All teachers are involved in relevant Professional Development.





Tertiary Educational Institutions






Tertiary Education Courses
